Monthly Night Flying Events

On the first Saturday evening of each month, weather permitting, the Jayhawk Model Masters have an after dark Night Flying event at our field by Clinton Lake. Flying at these night-time events is possible for pilots with a model designed by manufacturers for both day and night flying and can come with elaborate, built-in lighting systems, or pilots choosing a plane



from their inventory, sometimes one like my Valiant 1.3m that has seen a few too many vertical landings and just looks better after dark, and lighting it up with their own design and color scheme. LED kits are available for purchase online and for around \$30 or less you can turn a day only model into a day and night flier. Some LED kit options come with controllers to plug into the radio receiver so lighting presets can be controlled from the ground. Power for the LED's can be provided by the receiver's LiPo battery and the extra current draw by the lights is minimal.



It truly is a sight to behold, some of the boldest, brightest colors in the viewable spectrum dashing across a starry backdrop. Sometimes we line the runway with holiday lights, sometimes the illuminated planes themselves are the only light source, spare a few flashlights.



Above is a group photo of students and parents who attended the RC Aviation Experience class and flying exhibit this past November 2nd organized by Greg Inkmann.


